Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine follows: 20-A MRSA §257, sub-§1-A is enacted to read: 1-A. Issue; custodial parents. The commission shall issue a high school equivalency certificate to any residents of the State who: A. Are at least 15 years of age; B. Are unable to attend a public or private

school because they are the custodial parents of

12 13 14 15 16	This bill permits teen parents to seek a high school equivalency certificate by enrolling in a General Education Diploma program if their child care responsibilities prevent them from enrolling in a regular public school.
