STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

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Resolve, to Continue the Commission to Study the Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Security System.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Joint Select Commission to Study the

Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Security System completed its review of the similarities and differences between the 2 systems, developed a model to compare the pension benefits under both systems and submitted a report on its findings to the Governor and the 113th Legislature; and

Whereas, the new federal income tax law will affect the manner in which employer pension plans can be established and the regulations governing these plans will be developed early this year; and

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Whereas, litigation establishing whether Maine State Retirement System benefits are negotiable items under contract negotiations between state employees and teachers and their respective employers will be decided early this year; and

Whereas, the next step is to work with the actuary from the Maine State Retirement System to develop specific options for an integrated plan; and

Whereas, the commission's work to develop plans should be started in late winter or early spring of this year; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
