2. Allocation report. The Department of Mental
Health and Mental Retardation shall include, as a
supplement to the State's social services report, a
report which correlates its allocations, by area and
service program, with the total funds appropriated
and the needs identified by each licensed and funded
community service agency.

## 10 STATEMENT OF FACT

The addition of this section requires the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to solicit needs of community services, relate these identified needs to their proposed budget requests and report on the allocation of appropriated funds.

The effects of this bill include establishment of a process for the involvement of communities in state mental health and mental retardation services planning and the provision of a process of informing Legislators of community-identified needs and responses through state agency allocations.

Recommendations of the Interdepartmental Alcohol Premium Planning Committee related to the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation are included in the State's social services report and also affected, to that extent, by this bill.

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
