STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this bill is to narrow the scope 3 of conditions which are compensable under the Workers' Compensation Act. In Maine, there is currently 4 5 requirement that a condition be caused by a no work-related accident in order to be compensable. 6 Consequently, conditions associated with such things 7. 8 as aging, stress and the natural deterioration of the body are often the subject of workers' compensation 9 10 awards.

11 In at least 35 other states, an injury must be 12 due to a work-related "accident" in order to be com-13 pensable. It is the general rule nationwide. 14 Maine's departure from this general rule is partly 15 responsible for Maine's workers' compensation costs 16 being among the highest in the nation.

17 This bill places Maine in the mainstream with 18 other states.
