1 AN ACT to Make Allocations for the  
2 Administrative Expenses of the Bureau  
3 of Alcoholic Beverages, Department of  
4 Finance, for the Fiscal Years Ending  
5 June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.  
6

7 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
8 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
9 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

10 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
11 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

12 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-  
13 dent to the operation of the Bureau of Alcoholic Bev-  
14 erages and the State Liquor Commission will become

1 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1987;  
2 and

3 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
4 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of  
5 the Constitution of Maine and require the following  
6 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-  
7 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
8 therefore,

9 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
10 follows:

11 Sec. 1. Allocation of fund. In order to provide  
12 for the necessary expenses of operation and adminis-  
13 tration of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the  
14 State Liquor Commission, the following amounts, or as  
15 much as may be necessary, are allocated from the rev-  
16 enues derived from operation of the fund:

30 Sec. 2. Allotments required. Upon receipt of  
31 allotments duly approved by the Governor based upon  
32 work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer,  
33 the State Controller shall authorize expenditures  
34 from these allocations on the basis of these allot-  
35 ments and not otherwise.
