## STATEMENT OF FACT

7 This bill provides funding to continue the highly 8 successful rebate programs funded on a very limited 9 basis as demonstration programs, under Public Law 10 1985, chapter 818, Exxon Fund. The rebate approach, 11 with no income restrictions, is proving to be ex-12 tremely popular. By expanding funding, many thou-13 sands of Maine citizens can receive overcharge funded 14 rebate checks for energy conservation investments.

15 The furnace modernization rebate program will reimburse homeowners and rental property owners for 40% of the cost of modernizing their oil furnace equipment, oil water heater equipment and controls.

19 The small business rebate program provides rebates to businesses with fewer than 20 employees and 20 21 nonprofit entities for the cost 50% of of 22 weatherizing their structural facilities or for mod-23 ernizing their furnaces and furnace control equip-The pertinent provisions of Public Law 1985, 24 ment. chapter 818, shall apply for implementation of these 25 26 programs.
