- Sec. 4. Report. The Department of Human Services shall prepare and submit to the 114th Legislature a report on the managed care insurance plan during the 3rd year of the demonstration project. This
 report shall include, but not be limited to, the following information:
- 12 1. An assessment of the demonstrations' success in providing cost effective affordable insurance coverage for acute and primary care services for the target population;
- 2. An assessment of whether the demonstration should be continued, expanded incrementally to additional areas of the State, made a statewide project or discontinued; and
- 20 3. An assessment of plan contracting and compet-21 itive bidding options and a review of options for 22 program structure as a fully public or semipublic en-23 tity.

This bill will provide funds to develop and implement a managed care health insurance program for 3,000 previously uninsured individuals, primarily non-Medicaid eligible low-income citizens, in one urban and one rural site. These funds, combined with the money, \$250,000 a year, available from the repeal of the Catastrophic Illness Program law will be utilized to offer a cost-effective model approach for financing and delivery of health services to Maine's uninsured population, which is estimated to be 13% of Maine's population between the ages of 18 and 64, 93,000 adults.

The funding request is an integral part of the department's and the University of Southern Maine's

Robert Wood Johnson Foundation proposal, which received approval for funding of \$409,701 over a 3-year period in January 1987.
