Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §553-B, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1983, c. 477, Pt. E, sub-pt. 6, §1, is further amended to read:

9 1. <u>Annual salary.</u> The district attorney for each
10 of the several prosecutorial districts, as described
11 in section 553-A, shall receive an annual salary of
12 \$297520 until June 307 19847 and \$307996 thereafter
13 \$38,000 for fiscal year 1988, \$42,000 for fiscal year
14 1989, \$46,000 for fiscal year 1990 and \$50,000 for
15 fiscal year 1991 and thereafter.

4 3. <u>Additional sums.</u> In addition to the annual 5 salary as set forth in subsection 1, each district 6 attorney shall receive such additional sums for which 7 he qualifies under the following provisions:

A. \$1,200 \$2,000 for each full calendar year of
prior service as an elected or appointed Attorney
General, Deputy Attorney General, United States
Attorney or district attorney within the State of
Maine;

13B. \$300\$500for each 50,000 persons constitut-14ing the population of his district according to15the latest Federal Dicennial Census;

1 that district attorney salaries have parity with 2 those of judges of the Superior Court which were set 3 at that time for both at \$23,500 a year. Since then, 4 the salaries of Superior Court judges have risen to 5 the present level of \$63,625 and which will increase 6 to \$68,715 on July 1, 1987, and \$73,100 on July 1, 7 1988.

8 By contrast, district attorneys have not had a base salary increase in 4 years and they presently 9 10 receive an average salary of \$39,971, range of \$33,496 to \$46,696. Further, population increases, 11 child abuse cases and drug related prosecutions have 12 13 caused dramatically increased caseloads, particularly 14 in southern Maine, which require significant addi-15 tional funding for assistant district attorneys.
