IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend the Registration Laws Concerning Antique Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRSA $\S114$, 2nd \P , as amended by PL 1979, c. 607, $\S2$, is further amended to read:

The Secretary of State is authorized to and issue registration plates for antique autos, horseless carriages and street rods. These plates Auto, " shall bear the inscriptions "Antique "Horseless Carriage" or "Street Rod" and "Maine." Present owners of antique motor vehicles shall be permitted to keep their existing registration plate numbers for the new registration plates issued under this section. The Secretary of State shall allow the

1 2 3 4 5 6 7		owner of an antique motor vehicle to use a registration plate which was issued in the same year as the car was manufactured, provided that the plate conspicuously bears on it that year. The fee for registration of an antique auto or horseless carriage shall be \$10. The fee for registration of a street rod shall be \$25.
