# STATEMENT OF FACT

Severly emotionally disturbed children and adolescents can be served in their communities, and diverted from more costly residential treatment and hospitalization only with effective coordination by providers of mental health, health, child welfare and correctional services. Of Maine's estimated 25,000 children and adolescents with mental health problems, 6,000 present serious, long-term emotional and behavioral problems such as severe depression, anxiety, aggression and self-destructive behaviors which require services from a variety of community resources. Presently, service coordination is provided in York County, Penobscot County and Cumberland County by the Child and Adolescent Service System Project through a grant from the National Institute of Mental Health.
