§821. Contingent fees agreements and attorney expenses and disbursements

Every attorney preparing to enter into a contingent fee agreement with a client shall, prior to entering into the agreement, inform the client, orally

1	and in writing, that, whether the contingency upon
2	and in writing, that, whether the contingency upon which compensation is to be paid to the attorney by the client occurs or does not occur, the client is liable to the attorney for the attorney's reasonable

 2 The purpose of this bill is to ensure that a cli-3 ent entering into a contingent fee agreement with an 4 attorney is aware of reimbursements the client will 5 be required to make to the attorney whether or not 6 the client's case is won.
