AN ACT to Require Candidates to Identify

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21-A MRSA §1014, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

1. Authorized by candidate. Whenever any person makes an expenditure to finance communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate through broadcasting stations, newspapers, magazines, outdoor advertising facilities, direct mails and other similar types of general public political advertising and through

nonperiodical publications, the communication, if au-
thorized by a candidate, a candidate's authorized po-
litical committee or their agents, must clearly and
conspicuously state that the communication has been
so authorized and must clearly state the name and ad-
dress of the person who made or financed the expendi-
ture for the communication, as well as the candi-
date's political party.

## 9 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that a candidate shall identify his political party on any advertisements that a candidate circulates.

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
