IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN
AN ACT to Provide State Reimbursement to Municipalities for Property Tax Losses Due to State-owned Property.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §271, sub-§2, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 764, §8, is amended to read:
A. Hear and determine appeals according to the following provisions of law <u>and as authorized</u> <u>elsewhere in this Title</u> :
(1) The tree growth tax law, chapter 105, subchapter II-A;
(2) The farm and open space law, chapter 105, subchapter X;
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1	(3) As provided in section 843;
2	(4) As provided in section 844;

5	Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §662 is enacted to read:
6	§662. Reimbursement to municipalities for state-
7	owned property
8	1. Reimbursement. The Treasurer of State shall
9	annually on November 1st make payments to municipali-
10	ties to reimburse them for property tax losses re-
11	sulting from the presence of certain state-owned
12	property located within the municipality.
13	2. Property subject to reimbursement. The fol-
14	lowing categories of state-owned property are subject
15	to reimbursement under this section:
16	A. Property subject to supervision by the De-
17	partment of Corrections; and
18	B. Property subject to supervision of the De-
19	partment of Mental Health and Mental Retardation.
20	3. Amount of payment. The amount of reimburse-
21	ment shall be equal to 50% of the property tax loss
22	to each municipality for the preceding state fiscal
23	year. That loss shall be determined by multiplying
24	the estimated municipal value of reimbursable proper-
25	ty times the municipal mill rate and dividing by 2.
26	4. Estimation of value of reimbursable property.
27	The State Tax Assessor shall, by August 1st, annual-
28	ly, estimate the municipal value of reimbursable
29	property in each municipality, for the preceding
30	state fiscal year and certify that amount to the
31	Treasurer of State.
32	5. Appeals. A municipality which disagrees with
33	the determination of municipal value made by the
34	State Tax Assessor may appeal that determination to
35	the State Board of Property Tax Review.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for reimbursement to municipalities for 50% of the property tax loss of municipalities with state-owned property which is under the supervision of the Department of Corrections and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation.

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
