Whereas, the Welfare, Education and Employment Training Program, which provides training and employment opportunities to Aid to Families with Dependent Children parents with the goal of enabling them to become self-sufficient and to eliminate their dependency on public assistance, has suffered a substantial reduction in federal financial support in the last year; and

1 2 3 4 5	Whereas, many more Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients are in need of and have requested training and employment services from the Welfare, Education and Employment Training Program than it can presently provide; and
6 7 8 9 10	Whereas, this unavailability of funds will post- pone the point at which these Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients will be able to be self-sufficient at great cost to them and the state; and
