STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Reduce the Fee for a Trapper's License for Servicemen Stationed in the State.

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

7 12 MRSA §7071, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1981, c. 8 414, §8, is further amended to read:

9 4. <u>Servicemen permanently stationed in Maine.</u> 10 The following persons are eligible for any <u>trapping</u>, 11 fishing, hunting or combination fishing and hunting 12 license or permit at the resident fee and shall have 13 the same privileges as Maine residents in regard to 14 trapping, hunting and fishing:

1 A. Any person serving in the Armed Forces of the 2 United States who is permanently stationed at a 3 military or naval post, station or base in the 4 State; and

5 B. The spouse and children of that person, pro-6 vided that the spouse and children permanently 7 reside with that person.

Such a member of the Armed Forces desiring a trap-8 ping, hunting, fishing or combination license or per-9 mit shall present certification from the commander of 10 11 his post, station or base, or from the commander's designated agent, that the person mentioned in the 12 13 certificate is permanently stationed at that post, 14 station or base. Licenses and permits shall be is-15 sued by the clerk or agent of the town in which that military or naval post, station or base is situated. 16

STATEMENT OF FACT

18 This new draft replaces the language of the bill 19 to add a trapping license to the licenses that ser-20 vicemen stationed in the State are already eligible 21 to acquire at a resident rate.
