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- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4801, sub-§1, as amended by 7 PL 1985, c. 624, is further amended to read:
 - 1. Number. A school administrative unit shall make provision for the maintenance of all of its schools for at least ±θθ 185 days a year. At least ±75 180 days shall be used for instruction. In meeting the requirement of a ±θθ-day 185-day school year, no more than 5 days may be used for in-service education of teachers, administrative meetings, parent-
- tion of teachers, administrative meetings, parentteacher conferences, records' days and similar activities.

1	A. The commissioner may reduce or waive the min-
2	imum number of days required on application from
3	a school board. The application must be sup-
4	ported in writing with a statement of the reasons
5	for the request.

B. Notwithstanding any other section of the statutes laws, school committees, with the approval of the commissioner, may adopt or amend rules necessary to implement an extended school year at the local level. The commissioner may make appropriate adjustments, not to exceed the allowable subsidy, to insure fair and equitable treatment in the distribution of state aid.

14 C. Notwithstanding this subsection, the commis-15 sioner shall promulgate a rule to provide that 16 local school units may allow secondary school 17 students to graduate up to 5 school days prior to 18 the regular end of the school year.

Sec. 2. Application. This Act does not apply to any school administrative unit until the expiration of any contract in effect on the effective date of this Act.

23 STATEMENT OF FACT

Many states are expanding their student year beyond the traditional 180 days. This bill does so in this State in order to improve educational opportunities and classroom instruction.

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
