( )	10 11 12 13 14 15	The secondary course of study shall include in- struction in health, safety and physical education, as prescribed by the commissioner, and physiology and hygiene, with special reference to the effects of al- coholic drinks, stimulants and narcotics upon the hu- man system. Secondary schools shall offer instruc-
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tion in cardiopulmonary resuscitation as part of a 1 2 health curriculum. Where possible the schools should 3 make use of local voluntary rescue services or hospitals to provide teaching aids and instructors. All 4 secondary schools shall offer instruction in 5 6 cardiopulmonary resuscitation starting in the school 7 year 1988-89. All schools shall assure that at least 50% of their graduating seniors cardiopulmonary resuscitation by the 8 have taken 9 end of the school year 1989-90, 75% by the end of the school 10 year 1990-91 and 100% by the end of the school year 11 12 1991-92 and each year thereafter.

13 Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take ef-14 fect August 1, 1988.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

16 The purpose of this bill is to phase in the requirement that students have instruction cardiopulmonary resuscitation before graduation. 17 in 18 It requires school units to offer instruction to 19 at 20 least some students in the school year 1988-89 and to assure all those graduating at the end of the school 21 year 1991-92 have had instruction in cardiopulmonary 22 23 resuscitation.

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
