1. Ancient burial ground. "Ancient burial ground" means any tract of land within a municipality 1 2 3 which has been used for more than 100 years as a burial ground. The term does not apply to a burial 4 5 ground owned and maintained by a religious organiza-6 tion or a cemetery corporation. 7 Burial ground authority. "Burial ground au-2. thority" means the cemetery commissioners, park de-8 9 partment or other authority having charge of public 10 burial grounds within the limits of a municipality. §1272. Ancient burial ground to be preserved 11 A municipality shall not alienate or appropriate for any use, other than that of a burial ground, any 12 13 14 ancient burial ground and no portion of such an an-15 cient burial ground may be taken for public use withauthority from the Legislature. If such an an-16 out 17 cient burial ground is appropriated for any other use 18 and the bodies buried in it or the monuments, 19 gravestones or other memorials are removed, the burial ground authority shall preserve a record of the 20 21 removal indicating the date of removal and the site 22 or place to which removal is made. 23 §1273. Care of neglected ancient burial grounds 24 Any municipality having within its limits an abandoned or neglected ancient burial ground shall take charge of it and keep it in good order and shall 25 26 27 repair or restore fences, tombs, monuments or other 28 structures in the burial ground, but no property 29 rights may be violated and no body may be disin-30 terred. 31 §1274. Removal of gravestones and memorials 32 No fence, tomb, monument or gravestone within a 33 burial ground may be destroyed, defaced or removed,

burial ground may be destroyed, defaced or removed, except in accordance with this section. A gravestone or other memorial for the dead which is more than 100 years old may be removed, with the approval of the owner of the burial lot in which the gravestone or memorial is placed or, if the owner is unknown, with the approval of the burial ground authority, for the purposes of repair or replacement, reproduction or

preservation and display in an accredited museum. Approval may be given by the burial ground authority only after a 7-day notice of a hearing published in a newspaper having a circulation in the municipality where the burial ground is located and after a determination by the authority following the hearing that removal is necessary or desirable for the protection and preservation of the gravestone or memorial. The owner of a burial lot who has not received notice of hearing, after removal, may request replacement of a gravestone or memorial so removed. The burial ground authority, if it is satisfied that the person is the owner of the burial lot, shall arrange for replacement of the gravestones or memorial.

§1275. Penalty for damaging burial grounds, structures, trees or shrubs

Whoever intentionally destroys, mutilates, defaces, injures or removes, except as provided in section 1274, a tomb, monument, gravestone or other structure for a memorial for the dead, or a fence, railing, curb or other enclosure for the burial of the dead; intentionally destroys, mutilates, removes, cuts, breaks or injures a tree, shrub or plant placed within that enclosure; or intentionally disturbs the contents of a tomb or a grave, commits a Class C crime.

3'4 the convicted offender is a minor, the court, If if it determines that the offender is unable to pay 35 36 treble damages, may require the offender to perform a specified work program at the site where the damage occurred for such period of time as, in the opinion 37 38 39 of the court, equals treble the amount of the dam-40 ages sustained.
