AN ACT to Provide a Waiting Period Prior to

3	Granting of Divorce.
<b>4</b> 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6	19 MRSA §691, sub-§3 is enacted to read:
7 8	3. Waiting period. Where the complaint is filed on or after October 1, 1987, an action for divorce
9 10	shall not be in order for hearing until 6 months or more after service of the summons and complaint.

This bill provides a 6-month waiting period prior to granting a decree of divorce to discourage the easy breakup of marriage by maintaining the marital relationship and fostering a reconciliation.

Currently, the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure provide a 60-day waiting period between the filing of a divorce complaint and the hearing of the divorce. This bill will supersede that rule.
