IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Permit Certain Abandoned Residential Underground Oil Storage Tanks to be Drained and Filled with Sand or other Approved Materials.

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 7 follows:

38 MRSA §566-A is enacted to read:

9 §566-A. Abandonment of underground residential oil 10 storage tanks

Notwithstanding this subchapter, the owner or operator of a residential underground oil storage tank which is not within 100 feet of a public or private drinking water supply, which has been or is intended to be taken out of service, may, instead of removing

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1	that tank, drain and fill the tank with sand, gravel
2	or other material approved by the board. Prior to
3	filling the tank, a licensed plumber or oil burnerman
4	must certify in writing that the tank is empty. The
5	board shall promulgate rules concerning procedures
6	for draining and filling tanks pursuant to this sec-
7	tion.

STATEMENT OF FACT

9 This bill allows residential underground oil 10 storage tank owners to drain and fill with sand, 11 gravel or other approved materials abandoned tanks 12 pursuant to rules of the Board of Environmental Pro-13 tection, as long as the tank is not within 100 feet 14 of a drinking water supply.

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
