5 6	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
7 8	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §2852, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 572, is repealed.
9	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §2852-A is enacted to read:
10	§2852-A. Damage to hives from bears

1 2 3	Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §7504, sub-\$1, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 440, §11, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
4 5 6 7	B. Beekeepers or landowners shall enclose hives with electric fencing approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and shall not set traps in the area of beehives.
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
9 10 11 12 13 14	The purpose of this bill is to require beekeepers to properly protect their hives with adequate electric fencing approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and prohibit the setting of traps in the near vicinity of beehives and the killing of bears themselves. Rather they shall notify game wardens and request necessary protection.
