AN ACT Concerning Access Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36 MRSa §574-A is enacted to read:

§574-A. Ineligibility; access fees

Notwithstanding section 574, an owner of a parcel containing forest land may not elect to apply under this subchapter if that owner charges a fee for any person to gain entry to, pass over or use any part of that land, including any road serving or providing access to that land; provided that this section does not apply when the owner charges a fee to another for commercial use of that land.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill provides that any person charging access fees for the use of his land shall not receive tree growth tax relief.
