SENATE AMENDMENT " B" to H.P. 662, L.D. 895,  
8 Bill, "AN ACT to Extend Maine's Bottle Bill."

10 Amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of  
11 the first line after the enacting clause (page 1,  
line 5 in L.D.) the following: 'Sec. 1.'

13 Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection  
14 1 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) adding af-  
15 ter the word "carbonated" the following: 'or  
noncarbonated'

17 Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection  
1 by adding at the end the following:

18

19 'A. "Noncarbonated drink" does not include milk  
20 or any beverage packaged specifically for con-  
sumption by infants.

22 **Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §1862, sub-§2, as enacted by PL**  
1975, c. 739, §16, is amended to read:

23

24 **2. Beverage container.** "Beverage container"  
25 means a glass, metal or plastic bottle, can, jar or  
26 other container which has been sealed by a manufac-  
27 turer and which, at the time of sale, contains 12  
28 ounces or less of noncarbonated beverage or one gal-  
lon or less of a any other beverage.'
