IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

Resolve, Reestablishing the Maine Commission on the Role of State Government in Providing Independent Living Opportunities and Services to Disabled Persons.

Commission established. Resolved: That there is established the Maine Commission on the Role of State Government in Providing Independent Living Opportunities and Services to Disabled Persons. The commission shall examine the entire range of services provided to disabled persons in this State, explore possible new opportunities to promote independent living by disabled persons and, based upon its findings, establish priorities and recommendations for legislative action with particular attention to the following areas:

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1. How independent living opportunities for dis abled citizens can be expanded and enhanced at little
or no cost to taxpayers;

How financial resources currently available 5 to the State for providing services to disabled persons may be redistributed so that programs which fos-6 7 ter self-determination, independent living and eco-8 nomic productivity can be maximized, as well as be-9 come more flexible to meet changing individual needs;

10 public How combined private 3. and sector 11 initiatives stimulate economic development can through the creation of independent living opportuni-12 13 ties that focus on removing financial disincentives 14 to disabled citizens in this State and thus reduce 15 long-term tax-supported dependency; and

16 How the various roles of Government, 4. State 17 private rehabilitation service agencies and client 18 advocacy groups can be defined, enhanced and modified 19 to provide the most appropriate service without du-20 plication or conflict and to develop a true partner-21 ship; and be it further

22 Resolved: That the commission Members. shall 23 consist of 15 members, a majority of whom are to be 24 disabled persons. The Speaker of the House shall ap-25 point one member of the House of Representatives and 26 President of the Senate shall appoint one member the 27 of the Senate; the Governor shall appoint one person the Department of Human Services, one 28 representing 29 person representing the Department of Mental Health 30 and Mental Retardation and one person representing 31 the Department of Educational and Cultural Services; 32 of the House and the President of the the Speaker 33 Senate jointly shall appoint 10 disabled persons who 34 broadly representative of the State's disabled are 35 population with particular consideration differing disabilities, ages and geography. qiven to 36 Eight of the 10 disabled appointees shall be consumers of dis-37 38 ability services or representatives of consumers' groups, rather than providers of those services; and 39 and 40 be it further

The commission shall, at its first meeting, elect one of its members to serve as chairman. All members of the commission shall be appointed within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve, with the first meeting of the commission to take place within 45 days of the effective date.

15 The commission shall be provided with all neces-16 sary independent staff assistance and receive infor-17 mation about problems and services from all appropri-18 ate offices of State Government.

19 Legislative members of the commission shall re-20 ceive a per diem compensation and all members shall 21 receive compensation for travel and other necessary 22 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; 23 and be it further

24 Appropriation. Resolved: That the sum of \$9,800 25 be appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislain fiscal year 1987 for the Maine Com-26 tive Account mission on the Role of State Government in 27 Providing 28 Independent Living Opportunities and Services to Dis-29 abled Persons to carry out the purpose of this re-30 solve.

STATEMENT OF FACT

32 This resolve reestablishes the Maine Commission 33 on the Role of State Government in Providing Indepen-34 dent Living Opportunities and Services to Disabled 35 Persons as originally established in Resolve 1985, 36 chapter 44.

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
