| 26             | 1. Operation. Upon appropriation of money for   |
| 27             | the Maine Job Development Fund created by section   |

| 30             | conjunction with or as a part of one or more other  |
| 31             | programs of the authority. This program shall be ad-  |

| 34             | 2. Permitted uses of fund. Money in the fund  |
| 35             | may be applied to carry out the powers of the author-   |

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6 B. Providing financial assistance to businesses eligible for assistance under this subchapter. The financial assistance may be used to finance 7 8 the production of new products and to help fi-9 10 nance innovations, inventions and new processes which may lead to the production of new products 11 or enable the applicant to significantly reduce production costs and increase market share for the product without reducing existing employment 12 13 14 15 levels, provided that the authority shall have no liability to any claimant for claims arising di-rectly or indirectly from the use or operation of 16 17 the product or process. 18

19 3. Limitations. Financial assistance under this 20 subchapter shall not exceed \$250,000 to any one busi-21 ness, or \$150,000 in the case of businesses assisted 22 under subsection 2, paragraph B, nor may it exceed 23 50% of the total project costs as approved by the au-24 thority. At a minimum, 10% of the total project 25 costs must be equity provided by the recipient of the 26 loan or financial assistance.

27 4. Criteria. Program criteria and procedures shall be established by rulemaking pursuant to Title 28 5, chapter 375, suchapter II, and shall include lim-its on the amounts of financial assistance provided 29 30 from the funds to any one business and requirements for sources of financial assistance in addition to the fund. The program shall be directed at small-sized and medium-sized businesses, as defined by the authority. The authority shall consult with 31 32 33 34 35 the State Development Office in establishing incen-36 37 tives to:

| 18     | taged persons;   |
| 19     | I. Utilize a significant amount of financial as-   |
| 20     | sistance in addition to that provided from the   |
| 21     | fund;  |
| 22     | J. Provide for training or retraining of dis-  |
| 23     | placed, dislocated or unskilled persons, in coop-  |
| 24     | eration with the appropriate state agencies; and   |
| 25     | K. Develop new products, technology, inventions  |
| 26     | or production processes which can help increase  |
| 27     | exports of Maine products and services out of the  |

| 30     | With respect to any loan made under this subchapter,<br>the authority, subject to rules promulgated under<br>this subchapter, shall give preferred rates and terms |

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1 to businesses meeting the criteria of this section 2 based on the extent to which they meet these crite-3 ria. 4 5. Assistance to municipalities to generate eco-5 nomic growth. One million dollars from the proceeds of the sale of bonds will be provided to the State 6 Development Office to provide municipalities with the resources for a program to generate jobs and business development. Potential uses of this money shall in-clude, but not be limited to, infrastructure develop-ment, planning and technical assistance marketing 7 8 9 10 11 ment, planning and technical assistance, marketing and other types of capacity building. Money availa-12 13 ble for the purpose of this subsection shall not be 14 used to provide financial assistance to businesses. 15 Recovery. To the extent permitted by 6. law, and except for financial assistance provided pursuant to subsection 2, paragraph B, the authority, by agreement, shall require repayment of amounts by any 16 17 18 19 business on which behalf money from the fund has been 20 applied or pledged to carry out this subchapter and, 21 by agreement, shall require interest or other premi-22 um on those amounts at such rate as the authority may 23 determine, and shall require such collateral to se-24 cure repayment as may be reasonably available, including junior liens as appropriate. The recovery may be deferred until such time as the authority 25 26 shall determine. 27 28 Report. The authority shall file and present 7. 29 a report to the joint standing committee of the Leg-
