8 9 .0 .1 .2 .3 .4 .5	2. Limit on disbursements. The board may net expend the first \$100,000 of income to the fund each year; except that \$42,825 may be expended from the fund in 1985-87 biennium to further the purposes of this chapter, with a minimum of 40% of the first \$100,000 to be disbursed as grants. The board may expend one One half of the amount of income each year which exceeds \$100,000, but which does not exceed \$500,000 shall be set aside for the development of

the trust fund. The board may expend the remainder 1 in accordance with the duties set out in section 4084. The board may not expend the amount of 3 each year which exceeds \$500,000. For purposes of 4 5 this section, income includes interest attributed 6 the fund pursuant to Title 36, section 5285. When 7 the total amount of the fund reaches \$4,000,000, con-8 tributions to the fund shall cease, as provided 9 section 5285, and the expenditures by the 10 board shall be limited to the amount of interest 11 credited annually to the fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Maine Children's Trust Fund was established The in 1985 in order to provide a mechanism for Maine taxpayers to voluntarily contribute to the establishment of programs designed to prevent abuse, neglect and mental illness among Maine children. Ιt therefore, essential that prevention programs funded as soon as possible. This bill allows the immediate use of the first \$100,000 taken in by fund, with not less than 40% of this money to be used as grants for prevention programs. Fifty per cent of funds over \$100,000 will be placed in trust fund in order to preserve the Legislature's inthe trust fund will eventually be tent that self-sufficient. The remaining 50% will be expended by the board in carrying out the duties assigned by the Legislature in the Maine Revised Statute, 22, section 4084. Among other things, the board will review and evaluate existing prevention programs, provide for the coordination and exchange of information, award grants, provide statewide educational and public information.

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
