STATEMENT OF FACT

2	This resolve establishes an independent dioxin
3	research program in the Bureau of Health, building on
4	existing research underway by the University of
5	Maine. Dioxin is one of the most toxic chemicals ev-
6	er tested. Trace quantities of this substance have
7	been found in the waste water treatment plant sludge
8	from municipal treatment plants and from pulp mills.
9	This sludge is currently spread on Maine agricultural
L 0	land under the supervision of the Department of Envi-
L1	ronmental Protection. This is an economical practice
L 2	and has benefits for the agricultural land. It is,
L3	therefore, in the public interest to obtain more in-
L 4	formation concerning the environmental and public
L5	health aspects of past and future sludge
L 6	landspreading in order that this beneficial practice
L7	can be sustained while avoiding undesirable environ-
