AN	ACT	Concerning	Nonresident	Clam	Licenses.
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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §6671, sub-§3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 737, Pt. A, §28, is amended to read:

3. Shellfish conservation ordinance. Within any area of the municipality, a shellfish conservation ordinance may regulate or prohibit the possession of shellfish; may fix the amount of shellfish that may be taken; shall limit the size of soft-shell clams in accordance with subchapter I, article 5; may fix the qualifications for a license, including municipal residency; may fix license fees; and may authorize the municipal officers to open and close flats under

specified conditions. A program or ordinance shall

1 not regulate areas closed by regulation of the 2 missioner. An ordinance may also provide for enforce-3 ment, protection and evaluation of a green crab fenc-4 ing program. No municipal commercial license may be 5 issued unless the applicant has a current shellfish 6 license, as provided in section 6601. The municipali-7 ty shall provide and reserve a minimum number of commercial licenses for nonresidents which shall be a 8 9 number not less than 10% of the number provided 10 When the number of resident licenses is less than 10 but more than 5, at least one 11 12 license shall be provided. When the number of 13 resident licenses is 5 or less, nonresident licenses 14 shall not be required. The fee for a nonresident li-15 shall be not more than 10-times-the-fee-for-a 16 resident-license,-provided-that-in-no--case--may--the 17 fee--for-a-nonresident-license-exceed-\$150 \$250. 18 tice of the number and the procedure for application 19 shall be published in a trade or industry publica-20 tion, or in a newspaper or combination of newspapers 21 with general circulation, which the municipal officers consider effective in reaching persons affected, not less than 10 days prior to the period of issuance 22 23 24 and shall be posted in the municipal offices 25 the period concludes. The period of issuance for resident and nonresident licenses shall be the same. 26 27 Subsequent to that period, the municipality shall may make any resident or nonresident licenses not granted 28 29 the period available to residents or nonresidurina 30 dents.

31 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the ceiling for how much a town can charge for a nonresident shellfish license. It also lifts the requirement that nonresident license fees not exceed 10 times the fee for a resident license. The bill gives a municipality discretion over whether to make unsold licenses available to residents and nonresidents after the period of issuance.

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
