Initial participation may be prorated for part of the first fiscal year of participation in the program. Subsequent participation shall be for full fiscal years. Fees shall be paid to the Bureau of State Em- ployee Health Internal Service Fund Account and shall be dedicated to the enhancement of the State Employee Assistance Program. | |

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies the funding relationship between the State Employee Assistance Program and the Bureau of State Employee Health Internal Service Fund Account. It further clarifies that the program covers all executive branch employees, families and retirees.

36 The bill also makes it possible for employees and 37 family members and retirees within the judicial 38 branch, the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Sys-

tem and the Maine Turnpike Authority to become part of the program by negotiating an agreement to join and pay a fee to the program. It makes sense to include these employee groups in the program because they provide services to the State similar to those provided by executive branch employees and are geographically dispersed in a similar manner. It is more economical to have these groups join the existing program which provides statewide coverage than to have them establish a new overlapping program.
