IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend the Reporting Requirements at the Workers' Compensation Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

39 MRSA \$108, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 713, §2, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Annually, on or before March 1st, the chairman of the commission and the Superintendent of Insurance shall jointly provide a report to the Governor and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over business legislation. This report shall set out current and comparative trends in workers' compensation insurance for the preceding year, both in the State and in other jurisdictions.
