- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That there is es-18 tablished the Commission to Study the Use of Involun-19 tary Services for Substance Abusers, consisting of 6 20 members, 3 members to be appointed by the President 21 of the Senate and 3 members to be appointed Speaker of the House within 30 days of the effective 22 23 The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall notify the Executive Director of the 24 25 Legislative Council as soon as the appointments are 26 made; and be it further
 - Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine and propose recommendations to improve the laws concerning the involuntary commitment of substance abusers to treatment programs, including current practices under the laws; the enforcement of current laws; whether the laws apply to the full range of persons intended to be served by the laws; and whether clients' rights are sufficiently recognized and protected; and be it further
- Meetings. Resolved: That the commission shall meet as necessary to study the issues through examination of data from Maine and other states, to consult with experts and persons involved with the pro-

grams and to conduct public hearings if necessary;
and be it further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall prepare a report to be submitted, together with any accompanying legislation, no later than January 31, 1988, to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature; and be it further

Assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council and the Department of Human Services shall provide the commission with sufficient staff assistance and pertinent existing information to carry out these duties; and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, for days of attendance at commission meetings. If the commission meets on a day when the Legislature is in session, the members of the commission shall receive only one legislative per diem on that day. All members of the commission shall receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

Convening of commission; selection of chairman. Resolved: When the appointment of all members of the commission is completed, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall call the commission together for its first meeting no later than September 7, 1987. The commission shall select a chairman from among the commission members.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve creates the Commission to Study the use of Involuntary Services for Substance Abusers. There is growing concern about the adequacy of many aspects of the current law and whether the law is used appropriately. The commission created under this resolve will make a comprehensive analysis of the issue and recommend legislation or other changes necessary to improve the current system.
