STATEMENT OF FACT

In the State, there is an increasing number 15 of 16 persons suffering from speech-language and hearing 17 disorders who cannot avail themselves of services due 18 to costs or availability of trained professionals. 19 This growing population includes: Low birth weight infants; traumatically brain injured; persons suffer-20 21 ing from debilitating nervous system diseases and 22 stroke; hearing-impairment or deafness; mental retar-23 and preschoolers with histories of physical dation: 24 and sexual abuse.

25 Attempting to meet the needs of these diverse 26 is a statewide system of private, nonprofit, aroups community-based speech and hearing centers. 27 It has been increasingly difficult for these centers to re-28 29 cruit and retain staff due to salaries which, com-30 pared nationally and regionally, are below the 5th percentile. This problem is particularly acute in 31 32 the free-standing centers located in Aroostook Coun-33 Bath, Portland and Bangor, York ty, County. Turnover now approaches 80% every 2 years and the va-34 35 cancy period is approximately 3 to 4 months. Most 36 centers have not had full staff complements in over 2 years. To maintain financial viability, and especial-37 38 to offer minimally competitive salaries, Maine's ly 39 speech and hearing centers are being compelled to 40 provide services to individuals with the best finan-
