6	STATEMENT OF FACT
7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	The Municipal Public Employees Labor Relations Act has been in existence since 1969 (State Employees Labor Relations - 1974, University of Maine Labor Relations Act - 1975 and Judicial Employees Labor Relations Act - 1984). The Maine Labor Relations Board has been rendering decisions and orders since that time affecting municipal, state and University of Maine System employees. The purpose of this bill is to provide funding for an official indexing of the decisions and orders of the Maine Labor Relations Board in matters of prohibited practice complaints, unit determinations and unit clarifications.
19 20 21	This bill provides \$10,000 to the Maine Labor Relations Board to index the Maine Labor Relations Board decisions for use by their constituency groups.
