1. Investigative agent; prohibited actions. No person acting as an undercover or undisclosed inves-

23 24	3. Violation. Any person who violates this section is guilty of a Class D crime.
25	STATEMENT OF FACT
26 27 28	The purpose of this bill is to prohibit payment to undercover law enforcement operatives with nonpublic funds.

The integrity and impartiality of such operatives is enhanced by prohibiting the communication to 3rd parties of information of a noncriminal nature received during the course of a criminal investigation.

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
