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1	1. Citizen's Advisory Board. The Citizen's Ad-
2	visory Board, as established in Title 5, section
3	12004, subsection 10, paragraph A, subparagraph
4	(73-A), shall consist of 11 members, appointed in the
5	following manner:
6	A. Three members shall be appointed by the Pres-
7	ident of the Senate;

10	C. Three members shall be appointed by the Gov-

The members of the board shall serve 3-year terms, except that the initial appointments shall be made in the following manner: Of the 3 ap- pointments made by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House and the Governor, one person shall be appoint to a term of 3 years, another person appointed to a term of 2 years and another person ap- pointed to a term of 1 year; of the 2 appointments made by the Board of Directors of Pine Tree Legal Services, one person shall be appointed to a 3-year term and the other person to a 2-year term.
27	3. Chairman. The members of the Citizen's Ad-
28	visory Board shall appoint a chairman, who shall call
29	regular meetings and make reports to the Public Util-
30	ities Commission.
31 32	4. General powers. The Citizen's Advisory Board shall have the following powers and duties.
33	A. The board shall conduct regular meetings.
34	The Public Utilities Commission Consumer Assist-
35	ance Division shall assist in drafting agenda and
36	providing information as needed.

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B. The board shall cooperate with the Public Utilities Commission to review its decisions, activities, operations and the rates it has set for any public utility.

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C. The board may obtain informational data from any public utility.

D. The board shall advise the Public Utilities Commission and its staff advocates on consumer interests and concerns.

E. The board shall recommend appropriate demonstration programs and rates which are of benefit to residential ratepayers.

5. Written response required. When any person participates in Public Witness Days Program, by testifying either orally or in writing before the Public Utilities Commission, the Public Utilities Commission shall be required to respond in writing within 60 days of the person's testifying.

6. Protection of customers who testify from harassment. No public utility official may harass in any manner any person who participates in the Public Witness Days Program or who signs a formal complaint or otherwise petitions the Public Utilities Commission or any public utility.

25 7. Bill inserts. Every public utility shall in 26 clude, in its regular monthly billing, information
27 explaining that customers may participate in the
28 rate-making process.

A. The Public Utilities Commission shall promulgate rules which shall:

31(1) Designate the volume and type of infor-32mation to be included as bill inserts;

33(2) Specify how these inserts shall explain34that customers may participate in the rate-35making process; and

36(3) Mandate that the inserts encourage cus-37tomers to participate in the rate-making38process.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill creates a Citizen's Advisory Board 3 which will allow citizens a greater role in the rate-4 making process.

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
