AN ACT to Provide for the Creation of Liens

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8 9 10 11 12	Every individual, partnership or corporation, having an established place of business in this State, engaged in making, altering, repairing or cleaning any watch, clock, jewelry, electric motor, major and traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 horsepower, radio and other electronic equip-

ment, musical instruments, and in cleaning, repairing 1 2 or pressing of clothes, or expending any labor or ma-3 terials thereon, shall have a lien upon said watch, clock, jewelry, clothes, electric motor, major 4 5 traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 б horsepower, radio and other electronic equipment 7 musical instrument for a reasonable compensation for 8 said the labor and materials, which shall take prece-9 dence of all other claims and incumbrances. 10 watch, clock, jewelry, clothes, electric motor, major 11 and traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 12 horsepower, radio and other electronic equipment 13 musical instrument shall be exempt from attachment or 14 execution until such lien and the cost of enforcing 15 it are satisfied.

The lien holder shall retain such watch, jewelry, clothes, electric motor, major and traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 horsepower, radio and other electronic equipment and musical instrument for a period of 6 months, at the expiration which time, if such lien is not satisfied, he may sell such watch, clock, jewelry, clothes, electric motor, major and traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 horsepower, radio and other electronic equipment and musical instrument at public or private sale, after giving 30 days' notice in writing to the owner, specifying the amount due, describing property to be sold and informing him that the payment of such amount within 30 days shall entitle him to redeem such property. Such notice may be given by mailing the same addressed to the owner's place of residence if known, or if the owner's place of residence is unknown, a copy of such notice may be posted by the holder of such lien in 2 public places in town, village or city where the property is held.
