#### STATEMENT OF FACT

7 Hospitals have historically included an allowance for bad debts in a reserve account in accordance with 8 9 generally accepted accounting principles. The Health Care Finance Commission uses a different process to 10 arrive at a net allowance for bad debts. This bill 11 will cause the commission to use the total allowance for bad debts as included in the hospitals' financial 12 13 14 reports.
