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1	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless
2	the context indicates otherwise, the following terms
3	have the following meanings.

"Coerce," "command" or "advise" means to com- pel by threat or force, to instruct any person over whom the officer or employee has a supervi- sory authority, to instruct during business hours, upon the property or premises of the State or by using the facilities or services of the State.
11	B. "Election" means any primary, general or spe-
12	cial election for the nomination or election of
13	municipal county or state officials. "Election"
14	may not include referenda.
15 [.]	C. "Nonpartisan election" means an election oth-
16	er than a partisan election.
17	D. "Officer" or "employee of this State" means
18	an employee in the classified or unclassified
19	service, as defined in sections 931 and 7032,
20	subsection 3.
21	E. "Partisan election" means an election in
22	which a candidate may be nominated or elected as
23	a representative of a party, as defined in Title
24	21-A, section 1, subsection 28.
25	2. Use of official authority. No officer or em-
26	ployee in the classified service of this State may
27	use his official authority or influence for the pur-
28	pose of interfering with or affecting the result of
29	an election or a nomination for office.
30	3. Coercion of contributions. No officer or em-
31	ployee in the classified service of this State may
32	directly or indirectly coerce, attempt to coerce,
33	command or advise a state officer or employee to pay,
34	lend or contribute anything of value to a party, com-
35	mittee, organization, agency or person for political
36	purposes.
37	An officer or employee of this State may make and so-
38	licit contributions to a political party, organiza-
39	tion or candidate and may donate his own funds, time

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or services to a political cause provided the solicitation or donation of time or services is not made during the employee's state working hours or upon the property or premises of the State or by using the facilities or services of the State. An officer or employee of this state may not solicit political contributions from persons with whom he deals in an official capacity.

4. Participation in nonpartisan affairs and nonpartisan elections. No officer or employee of this State may directly or indirectly interfere with the participation of any employee of this State in the nonpartisan affairs of any municipality or other political subdivision of this State provided that no conflict of interest results.

16 For the purpose of this section, a "conflict of interest" means a situation in which an employee's participation in the affairs of a municipality results in financial gain to him or members of his family other than any regular compensation paid to him as an officer of that municipality.

Participation in partisan affairs. No offi-5. cer or employee of this State may be a candidate for a state office, except those identified under section 931, subsection 1, paragraphs A, B and E, nor may they be a candidate for a partisan office without receiving, prior to filing as a candidate, a written statement from the Director of Human Resources indicating that he is not a "state or local officer or employee" as defined by the United States Code, Title 5, Section 1501, as amended. A partisan election is one in which any of the candidates is to be nominated or elected as representing a party any of whose candidates for presidential election received votes in the last preceding election at which presidential electors were selected.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 present Civil the Service Law When was 3 recodified, there was an effort to consolidate provisions related to political activity of state employ-4 ees. This bill completes that effort. The bill also 5 6 increases state employees' rights to participate in 7 the electoral process. State employees may only be a 8 candidate for local and county partisan office if they receive a statement from the Director of the Bu-9 10 reau of Human Resources that they are not covered by 11 the Federal Hatch Act. State employees may partici-12 pate in raising and solicitation of political funds, 13 but may not coerce contributions from other state em-14 ployees. Coercion is defined consistently with deci-15 sions under the Federal Hatch Act and applies to all state employees even if they are not covered 16 by the Act. State employees are also prohibited from solic-17 iting from citizens with whom they have dealings in 18 their official capacity. This bill does not cover 19 20 elected officials or officers and employees of the 21 Legislature.

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
