4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6 7 8	34-B MRSA \$3005, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 467, is repealed and the following is enacted in its place:
9 10	§3005. Services to persons who are deaf or hearing impaired
11	1. Accommodations and services. The Bureau of
12	Mental Health shall provide accommodations and ser-
13	vices for deaf or hearing impaired persons providing
14	access to mental health programs funded or licensed
15	by the bureau. These accommodations shall include,
16	but are not limited to, the following:

1	A. Appropriate mental health assessments for
2	deaf clients;
