3. Registry. The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall maintain a register of cat and dog identification numbers and may assess a fee of up to \$1 per animal to cover the cost. 12 13 14 15

Permanent marking of dogs and cats would serve several humane purposes: Recovery of lost pets, identifying the person responsible for abandoned ani-18 19 mals, and reduction of damage to deer by dogs running at large. The bill requires such marking for dogs 20 21 and cats sold by a business organization or placed by 22 23 a shelter.
