STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clarify that the required courses of study in secondary schools do not require the construction of new or expanded facilities, unless indicated by the state board in writing, in which case state reimbursement for that construction shall be at the overall percentage utilized for state funding of education.

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
