Pel mass. The purpose of this bill is to provide a uniform identification card which may be used as a means of identification by persons in this State for cashing checks and verifying their identity. Since many persons do not have drivers' licenses and since persons under 20 years may not obtain liquor sidentification cards, these cards will provide these people with an equally valid means of identification.

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
