12	1. State buildings. The Bureau of Public Im-
13	provements shall require the installation and mainte-
14	nance of telecommunication devices for communication
15	for the hearing and speech impaired who rely on such

6 7 8 9 10 11	2. Other facilities serving the public. The commission shall promulgate rules requiring that telecommunication devices for the hearing and speech impaired be provided by the person who owns the public telephones within each public facility where public telephones are installed.			
12 13 14	3. Public facilities. For the purposes of this section, the following kinds of facilities shall be considered public facilities:			
15	A. Airport terminals serving scheduled flights;			
16	B. Bus and train depots;			
17	C. Ferry terminals;			
18	D. Clinics;			
19	E. Health care centers;			
20	F. Senior citizen complexes;			
21	G. Areas of public assembly;			
22	H. Hospitals;			
23	I. Covered malls;			
24	J. Convention centers; and			
25	K. Hotels with convention centers.			
26 27 28 29 30	4. Notice. A sign noting the availability and location of the telecommunication device for hearing and speech impaired persons shall be posted by the owner of the facility in a conspicuous location within each public facility covered by this section.

5 6 7	6. Rates. Toll calls from devices installed in accordance with this section are subject to the rate reduction prescribed in section 2361.
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
9 10 11 12 13 14	The present telephone system in public facilities is inaccessible to travelers who are hearing and speech impaired and must rely on telecommunication devices for telephone communications. The purpose of this bill is to make telephones at facilities serving the public accessible to this special population.
