Appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 13 members, appointed in the following manner: Two Senators appointed by the President the Senate; 3 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; the Commissioner of Human Services or his designee; the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services or his designee; one member of the State Board of Education, selected by the board; one guidance counselor, selected by the Maine Association of Guidance Counselors; one parent, teacher and one physician appointed by the Governor; and one nurse selected by the Maine Nurses Associa-The appointments shall be made within 30 days of the effective date of this Act. Those appointing or selecting members of the commission shall notify the Chairman of the Legislative Council of their appointments; and be it further

Covening of commission. Resolved: That when the appointment of all commission members is completed, the Chairman of the Legislative Council shall convene the first meeting within 15 days. The commission shall choose a chairman from among its members; and be it further

Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake to study the need for school-based health services established to address adolescent health needs and concerns including, but not limited to, pregnancy, parenting, suicide, mental health, substance abuse and sexuality and recommend appropriate educational programs and health services which may appropriately be provided in the public schools; and be it further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation to the Second Regular Session of the
