1           **Resolve, to Provide a One-year Moratorium on**  
2           **School-based Health Clinics and**  
3           **Establish the Commission to Study**  
4           **Clinics in Public Schools which**  
5           **provide Counseling and Services**  
6           **Relating to Pregnancy.**

8           **One-year moratorium on school-based health clinics.**  
9           **Resolved:** That there shall be a moratorium  
10          from the effective date of this resolve to April 1,  
11          1988, on the establishment of any new health clinics  
12          in public schools which provide counseling and services  
13          relating to pregnancy. The purpose of the moratorium  
14          is to permit a study and make a report to the  
15          Legislature; and be it further

16          **Study commission created. Resolved:** That there  
17          is created the Commission to Study Health Clinics in

1 Public Schools which provide Counseling and Services  
2 Relating to Pregnancy; and be it further

3 **Appointment. Resolved:** That the commission  
4 shall consist of 11 members as follows: Three Sena-  
5 tors appointed by the President of the Senate; 7 Rep-  
6 resentatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;  
7 and the Commissioner of Human Services or his desig-  
8 nee. The commission shall choose a chairman from  
9 among its members; and be it further

10 **Duties. Resolved:** That the commission shall un-  
11 dertake to study school-based health clinics which  
12 are established to address the issue of unwanted ado-  
13 lescent pregnancy and provide, in part, counseling  
14 and services relating to pregnancy; and be it further

15 **Funding. Resolved:** That there is appropriated  
16 from the General Fund to the commission the sum of  
17 \$12,000 to carry out the purpose of the study; and be  
18 it further

19 **Compensation. Resolved:** That legislative mem-  
20 bers shall receive per diem compensation and all oth-  
21 er members shall be reimbursed for travel and other  
22 necessary expenses; and be it further

23 **Reports. Resolved:** That the commission shall  
24 present its findings, together with any recommended  
25 legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the  
26 113th Legislature.

27 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

28 This resolve establishes a commission to study  
29 school-based clinics which are established to address  
30 the issue of unwanted adolescent pregnancy and pro-  
31 vide, in part, counseling and services relating to  
32 pregnancy.

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
