COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " H " to H.P. 813, L.D. 1087, Bill, "AN ACT to Restructure the Method of Appointment of Members of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission."

Amend the bill in the first line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Sec. 1."

Further amend the bill in section 1, in that part designated "§683." by striking out all of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 5, to carry out the purposes stated in section 681, is created within the Department of Conservation, and in this chapter called the "commission." The commission charged with implementing this chapter in all of the unorganized and deorganized areas of the The commission shall consist of 7 public members, none of whom shall be state employees, who shall appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the Joint-Standing-Committee-on-Natural--Resources standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources and to confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among there shall be 4 who shall be public members, knowledgeable in at least one of each of the following areas: Commerce and industry; fisheries and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the potential appointees to the commission, the Governor shall actively seek and give consideration to persons residing in or near the unorganized areas of the State and at least one-member 2 members shall be a-resident--of a--town--or--plantation residents within the commission's jurisdiction.'

1 2	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2.
3	STATEMENT OF FACT
4 5 6 7 8 9 10	The purpose of this amendment is to make certain technical corrections, to retain the existing criteria for commission members and to clarify the language directing that 2 commission members be drawn from the area within the commission's jurisdiction. Finally, the amendment retains the current provisions for towns being removed from the commission's jurisdiction.
