3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6 7	30 MRSA §4257, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 612, §14, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
8 9 10 11 12 13 14	No municipality or utility district may prohibit the owner of a lot or parcel of land from connecting with a sewer in a street or roadway that abuts that lot or parcel of land regardless of whether the sewer line operates by gravity or pressure; except that a municipality or utility district may require an exterior pumping station which is properly engineered to enter the pressure line.
