8 9 10	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §242, as amended by PL 1985, c. 762, §§26 and 27, is further amended by adding at the end 2 new paragraphs to read:				
11 12	With the approval of the Secretary of State, an annual registration fee for the State under the In-				
13	ternational Registration Plan may be paid in quarter-				

ly installments. If the person in whose name a vehi-

- cle is registered fails to make timely payments of a fee or an approved quarterly installment of the fee, the Secretary of State may suspend, without preliminary hearing, the registration of the vehicle pursu-ant to section 2241, subsection 3. In cases in which In cases in which a vehicle has been registered as part of a fleet there has been failure to make a payment for the ve-hicle, the Secretary of State may suspend registra-tions for all vehicles in the fleet.
- Vehicles being registered under the International Registration Plan shall be subject to a registration fee determined on a monthly prorated basis if the registration period is less than one year.

- Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Title, the Secretary of State, in concurrence with the Commissioner of Transportation, is authorized to enter into reciprocal agreements or plans on behalf of the State of Maine with the appropriate authorities of any of the states of the United States, the District of Columbia or any state or province of any country providing for the registration of vehicles on any apportionment or allocation basis and may, in the exercise of this authority, enter into and become a member of the International Registration Plan with an entry date of January 1, 1989 1990.
- 30 Sec. 4. 29 MRSA §2243-A, sub-§3, as enacted by 31 PL 1985, c. 735, §4, is amended to read:
 - 3. Registration transition. The annual registration of motor vehicles that are to be registered under the International Registration Plan become-void on-January-1,-1988,-and-the-annual-registration-fees for-these-vehicles, issued in the 12 months prior to Maine's entry, shall be prorated on a monthly basis and be rounded off to the nearest 1/4 of a dollar and issued for such a number of months as is necessary to expire on December 31st of the year prior to Maine's entry into the International Registration Plan.

/	18	This new draft accomplishes the following.
	19 20 21 22 23 24	Section 1 changes the statutory reference from the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29, section 245 to Title 29, section 242. The new draft also adds a 2nd paragraph providing for prorated registrations for vehicles in the International Registration Plan that register for less than one year.
	25 26	Section 2 repeals Title 29, section 245, the last paragraph and places it under Title 29, section 242.
	27 28 29 30	Section 3 moves the entry date into the International Registration Plan from January 1, 1989, to January 1, 1990, to allow time to explore the plan's impact on the State.
)	31 32 33 34	Section 4 provides for prorated registrations for vehicles in the year preceding entry into the International Registration Plan, allowing for a common registration year for those vehicles.

Section 5 creates a prorated excise tax to coincide with the prorated registration during the year preceding entry into the International Registration Plan and is only applicable to those vehicles that will be involved in the plan.

Section 6 repeals the excise tax credit.

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
