Resolve, to Provide a Retirement Benefit to the Beneficiary of Harriet V. P. Kaplan.

Retirement benefit. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17954, the Maine State Retirement System shall give the designated beneficiary of Harriet V. P. Kaplan the option of selecting the benefit provided by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17954, subsection 1, paragraph A; and be it further

priated from the General Fund the amount of \$55,500 which is the difference between the present value of the benefit to which Mrs. Kaplan's beneficiary is entitled and the value of the benefit to which he will become entitled if this resolve is enacted.

2 Harriet V. P. Kaplan, who was a teacher employed the City of Portland, died on January 12, 1986. 3 Mrs. Kaplan, prior to her death had accumulated 18 4 5 years and 28 days of service credit as a member of б the Maine State Retirement System and was one month 7 and 29 days short of reaching age 60. If Mrs. Kaplan had been age 60, or if she had 25 years of creditable 8 service, her beneficiary, Irwin R. Kaplan, would have 9 10 been entitled to a retirement benefit, based upon Mrs. Kaplan's years of service and average final com-11 pensation, of approximately \$591.88 per month. 12 Mrs. Kaplan had not completed 25 years of service nor 13 reached age 60, her beneficiary is entitled to a re-14 fund of her contributions (approximately \$22,500) 15 a monthly benefit of \$150 per month for his lifetime. 16 17 difference between the reserves (present value) 18 required for the benefit provided by the retirement 19 system laws and the benefit that would be provided by 20 this resolve is \$55,500. The Maine Revised Statutes, 21 Title 5, section 17155, provides that the entire ac-22 tuarial cost of benefits granted by legislation such as this shall be fully funded by the same Legislature 23 24 which enacts the special resolve or other legisla-25 tion.

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
