1 **AN ACT** Relating to the Membership of the
2 **Waldo County Budget Committee.**
3

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 **Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §1403, sub-§1, as repealed and**
7 **replaced by PL 1985, c. 737, Pt. A, §85, is amended**
8 **to read:**

9 1. Membership. The budget committee shall con-
10 sist of 9 members, 3 members from each commissioner
11 district selected as provided for in this section and
12 3 county commissioners who shall serve on the commit-
13 tee in an advisory capacity only and shall not vote
14 on any committee matters.

1 In ~~1985~~ 1988, and thereafter, at least 90 days prior
2 to the end of every other fiscal year, the 9 members
3 shall be elected by the following procedure.

4 A. The county commissioners shall notify all mu-
5 nicipal officers in the county to caucus by coun-
6 ty commissioner districts at a specified date,
7 time and place for the purpose of nominating at
8 least 3 one municipal officers officer from each
9 district as candidates a candidate for the county
10 budget committee; except that in 1988, at least 3
11 municipal officers shall be nominated from each
12 district. The county commissioners shall serve
13 as nonvoting moderators for their district cau-
14 cuses. Nominations shall be received from the
15 floor. The 3-nominees nominee receiving the most
16 votes shall be approved. Any other nominees who
17 receive a majority vote of those present shall
18 also be approved. The names of those duly ap-
19 proved shall be recorded and forwarded to the
20 county commissioners to be placed on a written
21 ballot.

22 B. The county commissioners shall have written
23 ballots printed with the names of those candi-
24 dates selected in their districts in accordance
25 with paragraph A. The county commissioners shall
26 distribute these ballots to each municipality.
27 Each commissioner district shall require a sepa-
28 rate ballot and each ballot shall specify each
29 candidate's full name and municipality. The mu-
30 nicipal officers shall vote as a board for 3 one
31 budget committee members member from the candi-
32 dates on the ballot and return the ballot to the
33 county commissioners by a certain date; except
34 that in 1988, the municipal officers shall vote
35 as a board for 3 budget committee members. The
36 ballots shall be counted at a regular meeting of
37 the county commissioners. Each vote shall be
38 weighed according to that municipality's popula-
39 tion as a proportion of the district's total pop-
40 ulation, except that no municipality may have
41 more than one budget committee member. The coun-
42 ty commissioners shall notify each municipality,
43 in writing, of the results of the election and
44 shall certify the results to the Secretary of
45 State.
